# Leadership Development Reading List

Leaders read. As Former Secretary of Defense Jim Mattis stated, "If you haven't read hundreds of books, you are functionally illiterate, and you will be incompetent, because your personal experiences alone aren't broad enough to sustain you." To that end, there is no limit to the number of reading lists available to leaders. Each of the Service Chiefs has a reading list that is updated every few years and most professional organizations to which you each aspire routinely publishes reading recommendations.

This reading list is not intended to replace or replicate those excellent resources. Instead, this list captures the recommendations of Commandant's Staff and ROTC Cadre for some key reads that should start you on your path to being a leader who reads. The name of the staff member recommending the book is also included so you can reach out and discuss with them why they think that book is valuable to your professional development.
